Paraphrasing a few snippets from the Patrick Moore video:

- Wind and solar are inherently intermittent. We cannot run our hospitals and schools and factories on power sources that disappear for 3 or 4 days at a time.
- Hydro-energy and nuclear power produce the least greenhouse gas per capita.
- Denmark is among the highest per capita in CO2 admissions in Western Europe.
- Sweden and France have actually shown an achievement in greenhouse gas reductions.
- Doesn't make sense to plug electric cars into coal fired power plants because it will increase a number of emissions, including CO2.
- We've built so much wind in some parts of the west and south that there's not enough transmission lines to carry the wind - another unintended consequence.

- My old colleagues in the environmental movement are actually the main impediment to reducing fossil fuel consumption and CO2 emissions, because they oppose the practical solutions...
